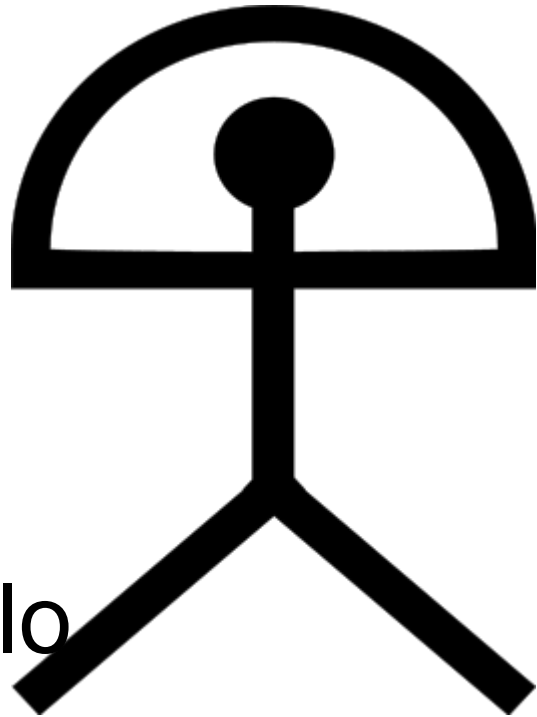


ALMERIA

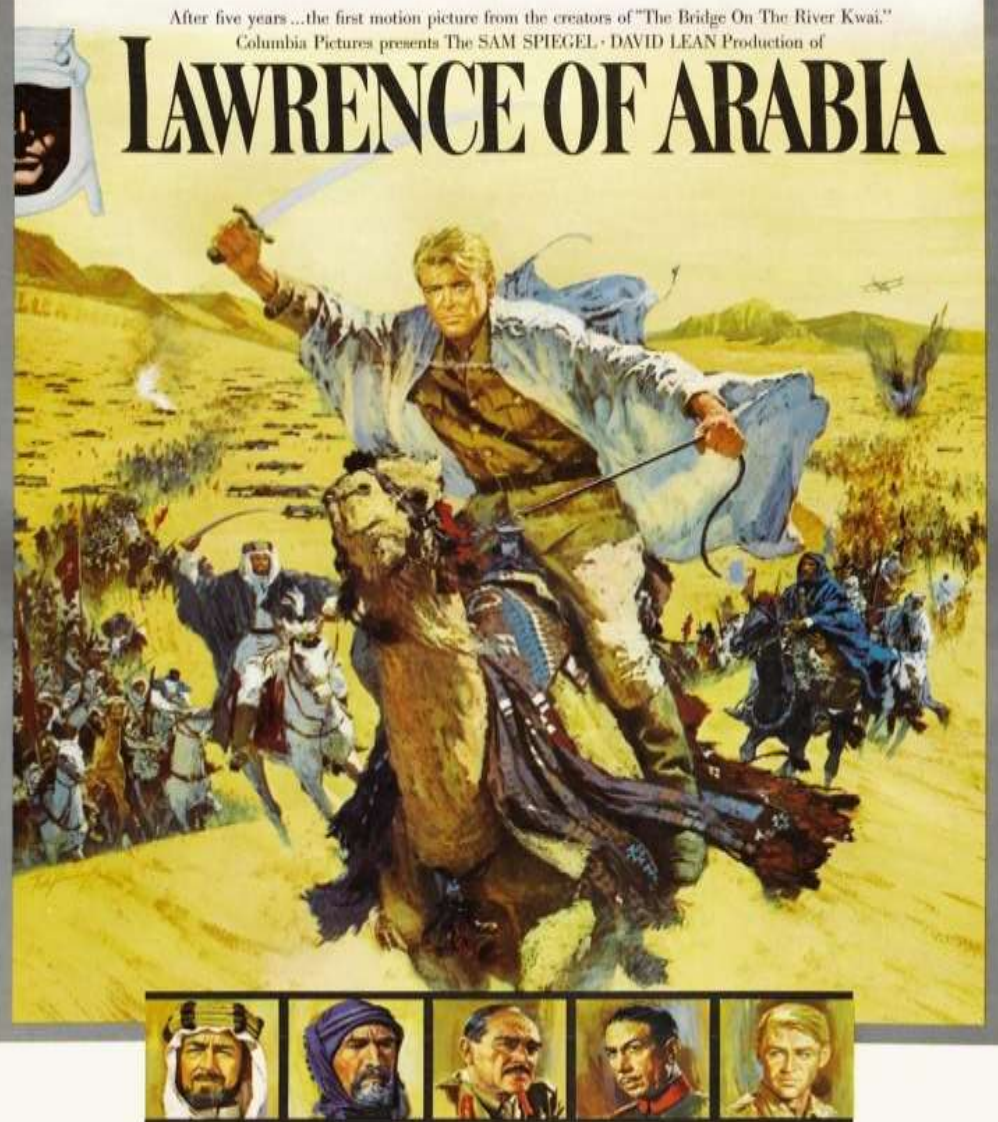

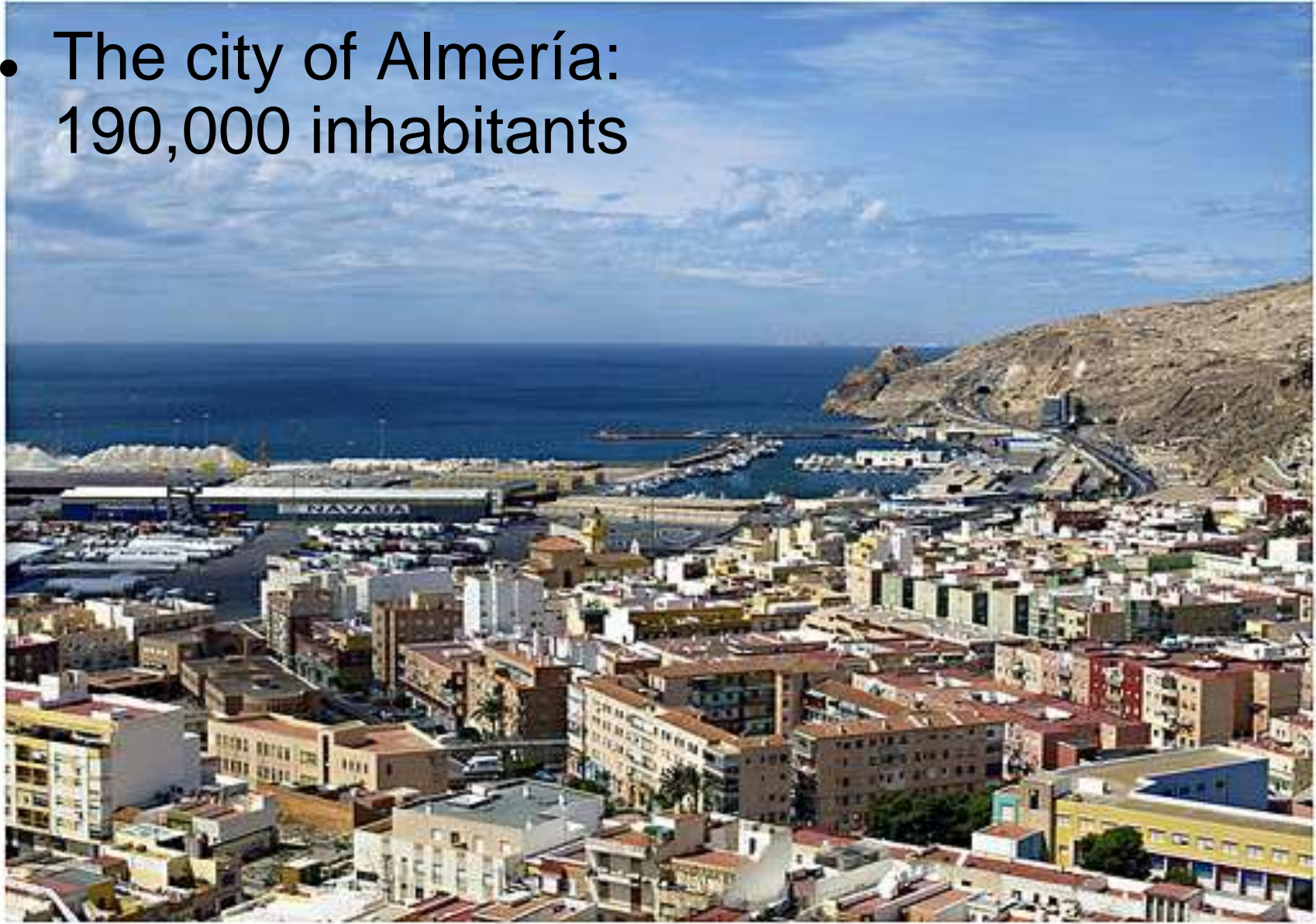
Europe's pantry- The plastic sea


